

What is Collection Manager?

- Manage metadata for electronic and print materials
- Output WorldCat records
 - Custom record editing options
 - Custom delivery options
 - Automatic updates
- Maintain holdings in WorldCat






How libraries use Collection Manager?

- Help users find your resources
- Improve local catalog quality
- Get new print materials into circulation
- Manage your electronic resources
- Save time maintaining collections


Typical workflow





WorldCat data sync

Synchronize data in a library's local catalog with WorldCat





How data sync works

Library creates data sync collection

Library submits data to OCLC OCLC reviews collection & approves collection for processing

OCLC processes submitted data and releases output

Library and OCLC review output files and reports

Library repeats process with new data



WorldCat query

Identify and download records based on WorldCat search indexes

How WorldCat query works






WorldCat cataloging partner

Combines data about your library's electronic resources to make your collections easier to find, share, manage and use.

Share

Quick and easy sharing of your electronic content

Manage


Manage budgeting, ordering and acquisition of electronic resources






